Captain's Blog Club Champs Report

A bit of context regarding the Club Championships that were held on Saturday, 18th May

The B Grade game between Peter Anderson number 1 ranked qualifier and Don Beames the number 6 qualifier, went to 38 holes, until Peter won the game.

The first 9 holes of this game were all square and there was some quality golf played and both players shooting very low 40s off the stick.

Holes 9 to 18 Peter won 5 holes and also injured his right elbow, to be 3 up.

Peter was in a world of pain and there were moments where he thought it was game over. Holes 19 to 27 Peter was still able to keep Don at bay and at one stage was 6 up, and then again Peter went down in pain holding that elbow and Don could see a glimmer of hope.

From the 23rd hole (5th) to the 32nd hole (14th) Don played great golf and the game was well and truly alive.

The pair then halved the next 4 holes and on the 36th hole Peter was 1 up and only needed a half to win.

Don pared the hole and it went to the first again until Peter won on the 38th hole much to his delight.

Kym wasn't going to let this lead slip and continued to win holes and the match was done with Kym winning 7 and 5.

Kym's recollection of the final

(It was a great game and I really enjoyed playing with Jarrod. It seems I am always slow out of the blocks not being used to playing so early in the day. My group usually hits off around 12.30 so having to start at 8.40 takes me awhile to wake up. I was 2 up at the 17th and then won the next 5 holes to be 7 up at end of the 4th. (I'd finally woken up) .

I did remark to Jarrod after the match that "being a young fella he had many years to pull off a win, my chances were reducing".

It was a very cordial game with both complementing each other on good shots.)

The D Grade match between Joe Michalik the number 7 qualifier and Eric March the number 8

qualifier again was a game of many twists and turns.

Joe thought it would be a good idea to rock up with 1 minute to spare and give Eric the sense that it would be a no show, but no, Joe came out of the box hard and fast and won all 4 holes to start this 27 hole battle.

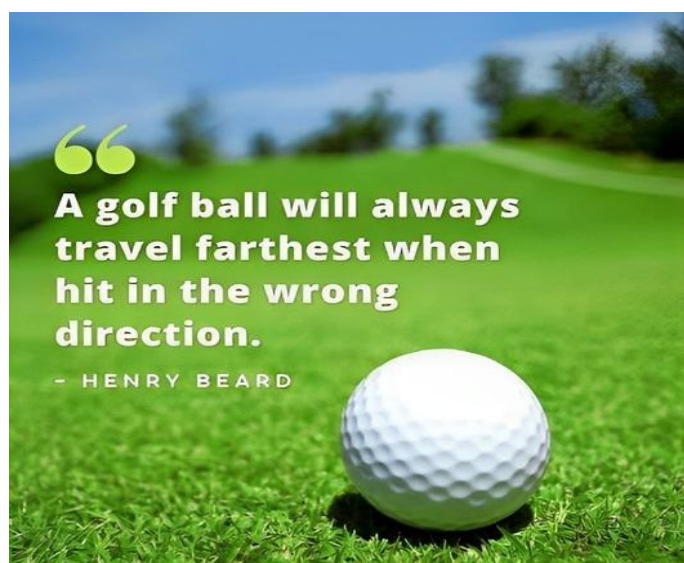
